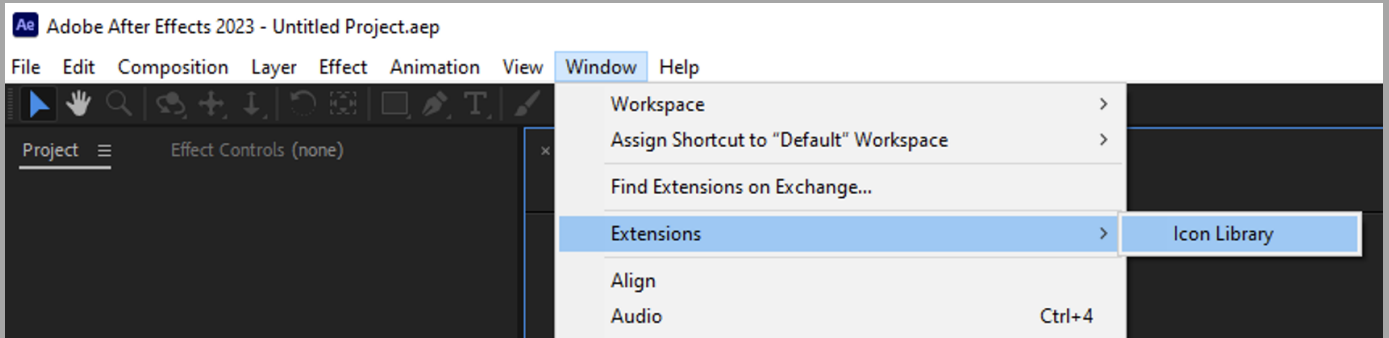

How to Install

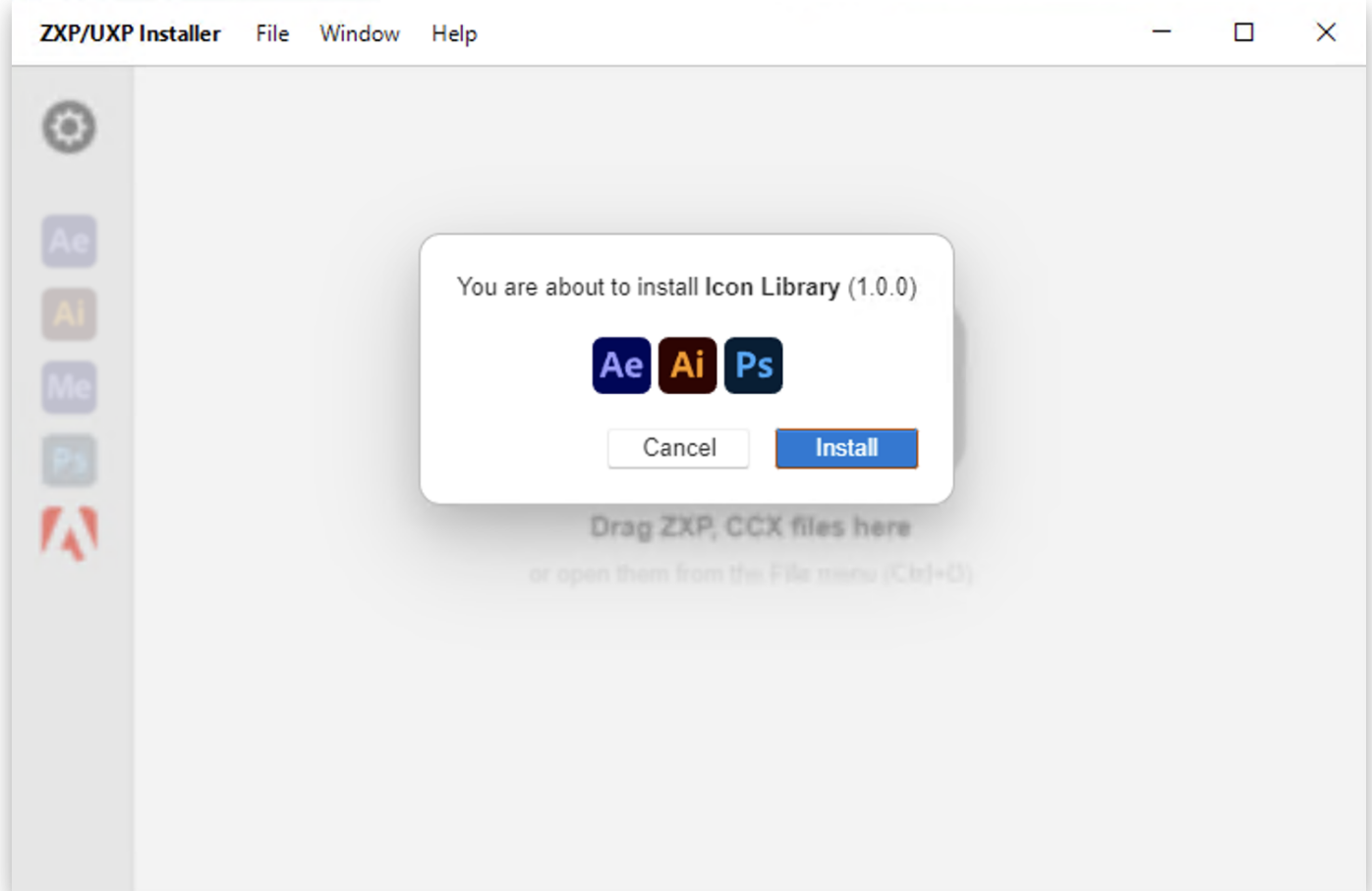
aescripts + aeplugins manager app (Recommended)

1. Download and install the aescripts + aeplugins manager app from [here](#)
2. Login to the manager app with your aescripts + aeplugins account that you used to purchase Icon Library.
3. Find **Icon Library** in your list of purchases.
4. Select it and choose **Install**
5. Launch your host app of choice (After Effects, Illustrator, or Photoshop) and go to **Window -> Extensions** and launch Icon Library



Manual Installation

1. Download and install the ZXP Installer from [aescripts + aeplugins](#)
2. Drag the ZXP file from your product download and drop it onto the ZXP Installer.
3. Follow the prompts to install it.

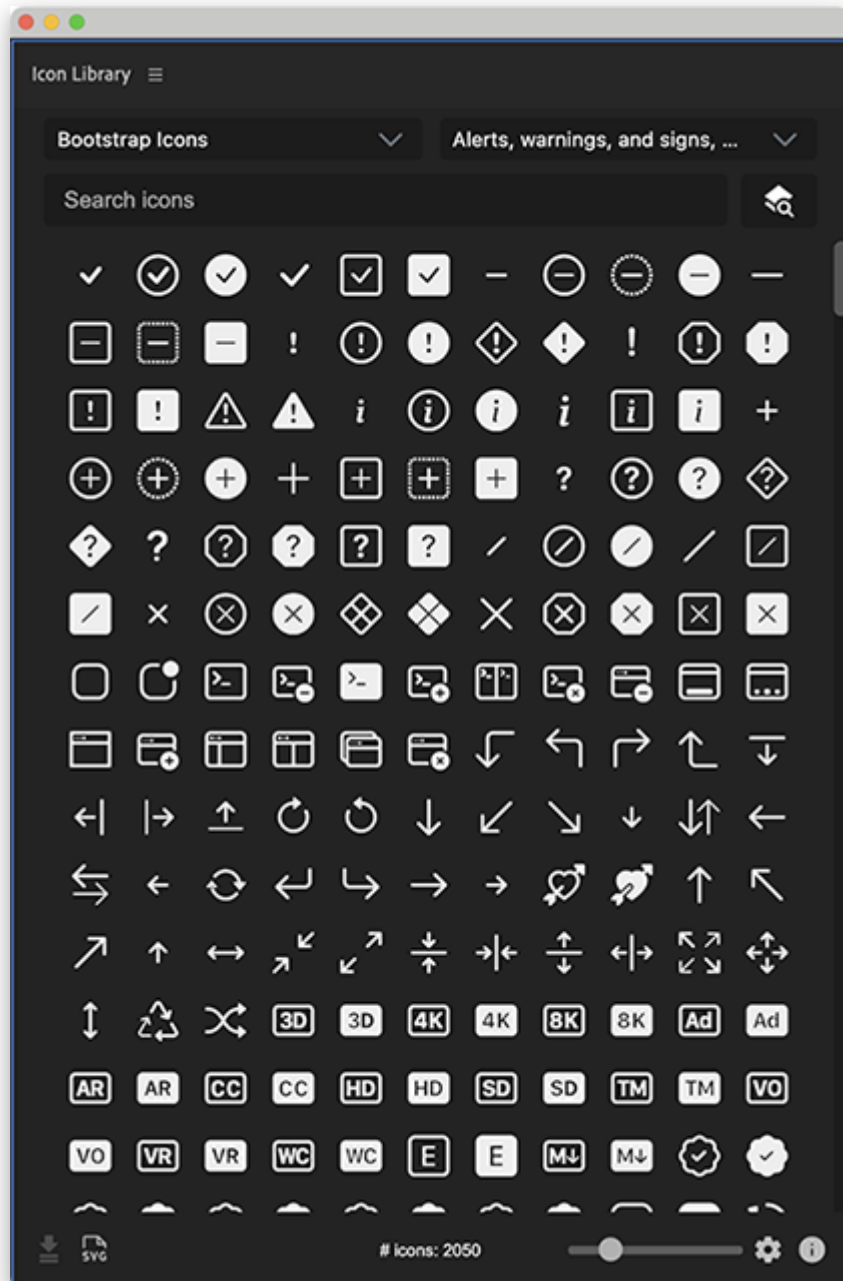


Trial Version

A trial version is available but it has the following limitations:

- Limited to first 200 icons of each library.
- Valid for only 7 days.

Main UI



Choose Your Library

Starting at the top left of the extension, the first field you come to is the selected library. Changing this will change all the icons that are shown. Visit [here](#) to see what libraries are currently available.

The second field shows what sub-categories are available for each library. From here, you can choose to only show a few categories, or hide categories you don't wish to see.

Search

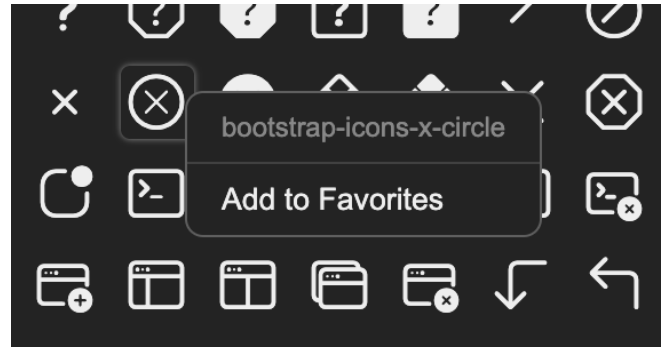
The search field will try to match both names and keywords of icons to give you the best results possible. No refresh necessary, it'll search and update as you type.

★ Favorites

If you right click on any icon, you can add it to your favorites. You'll now find Favorites as an option for a library source which will show you anything you've previously added.


You can even save manual svgs as favorites for easy re-use later on.

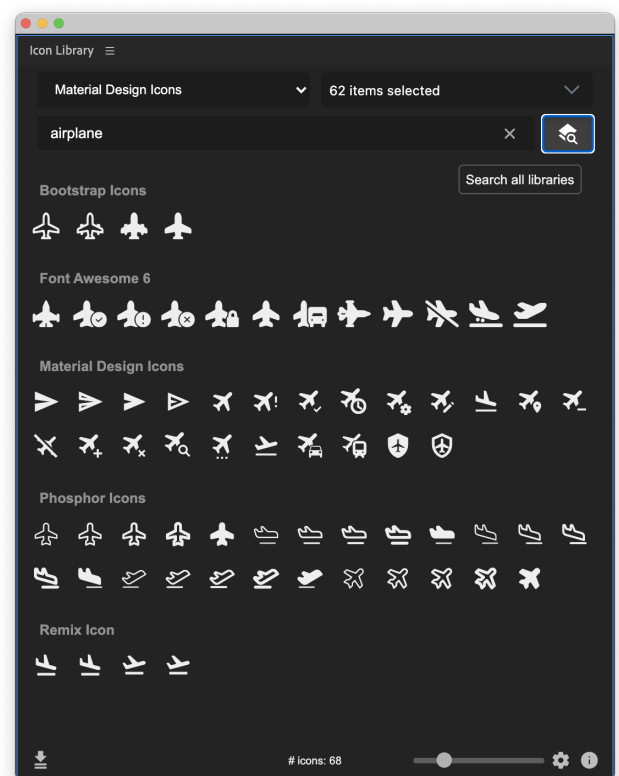


🕒 Recents

Similar to favorites, another option as a library source will show your most recently used 100 icons from any library.

🔍 Global Search

If you wish to search through all the libraries at once, type your query into the search field and click this global search button . It may take a few seconds to search through all the libraries' names & keywords, but the results will show in the normal body of the extension.



Import Multiple Icons

Clicking this button will import all the currently visible icons, each as their own layer.

For Performance & Reliability

Only available when showing 200 icons or less


Manual SVG (experimental)

If you have an icon that you want to use that's not in the library, you can try pasting it's code here and having Icon Library make a shape layer from it.

Limitations

Not all svg properties are currently supported. Things like masks, gradients, images, text, clipping paths and filters will throw an error.

Settings

Sizing

There are three options for sizing of the icon when imported.

1. **Fit to Width** - Scales the icon to match the comp's or document's width
2. **Fit to Height** - Scales the icon to match the comp's or document's height
3. **Pixel Size** - Specify a fixed width in pixels in the text field to the right

Color & Color Picker

Specify the hex code of what color you'd like icon to import with. Click the circle thumbnail to launch a color picker pop-up if you'd rather instead of specifying a hex code.

Layer Mode (After Effects Only)

Choose between masks on a solid layer, or shaper layer paths as the source of your icon

Is internet required to use Icon Library?

Internet is only required for the aescrpts licensing system. For more information on the licensing system, see [this](#).

Otherwise, no internet is required for the Icon Library data sources. Everything needed is packaged with the extension so it can work without internet just fine.

Can I use Icon Library icons in my project?

Probably, but depends...

Each icon library source is open source so it's likely that you can use it without issue, however each one has it's own license for use, so it's hard to make a blanket statement about every icon in every scenario. Please visit the info panel in Icon Library and click the license link for the icon source that you'd like to use. Some icon library sources require attribution.

Also, I am not a lawyer. Icon Library is provided “as is”, without warranty of any kind, express or implied...

Icon Library isn't showing up in Photoshop

Adobe is in the process of retiring CEP Extensions, the framework that Icon Library was built on. CEP doesn't run natively on Apple Silicon Macs, so in order for Photoshop to show

the Window → Extensions (legacy) menu item, Photoshop needs to be opened using Rosetta.
