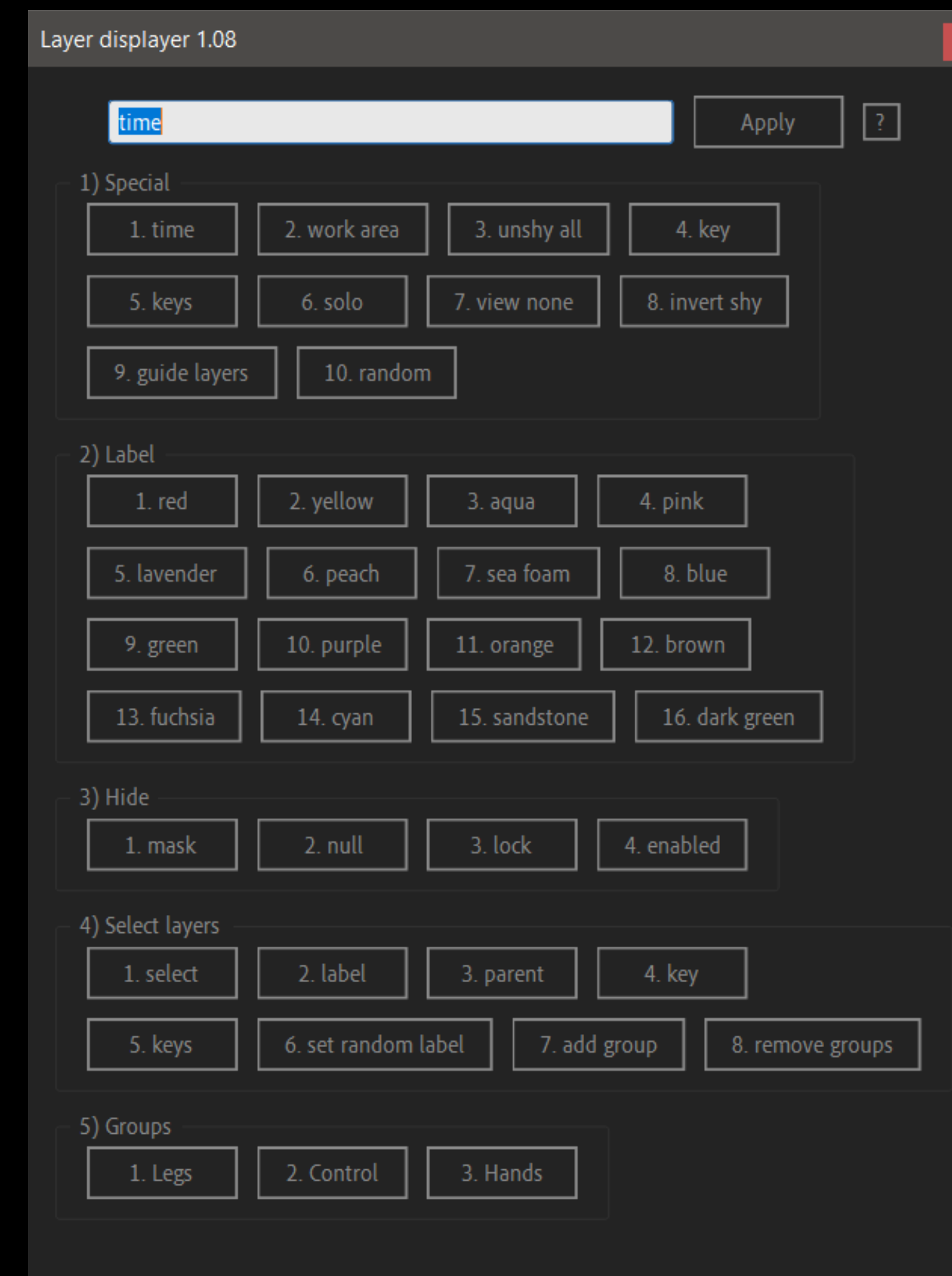

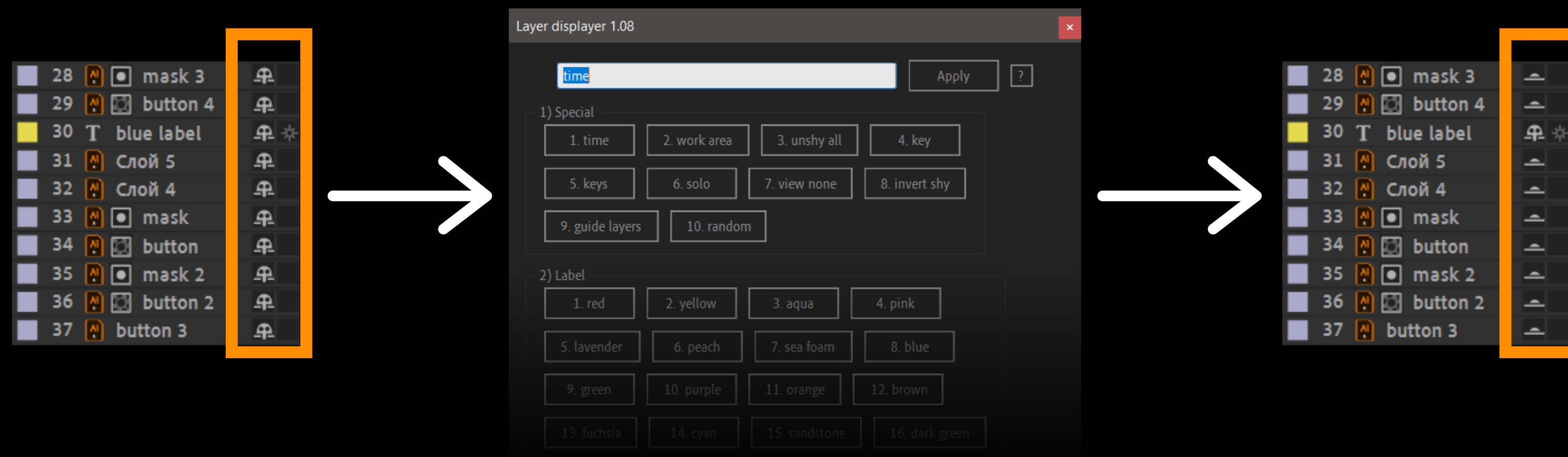

Introduction

Layer displayer is a script that shows layers on request. It analyzes your layers and hides everything unnecessary using the “shy” layer property. It is also worth paying attention to the fact that the gray layers are hidden automatically, which must be taken into account in the process.



The script was run on versions from 2014 to 2018. Since the ability to conveniently assign a script to a hot key appeared in the 2018 version of the after effect, I recommend installing it on versions from 2018 and above.

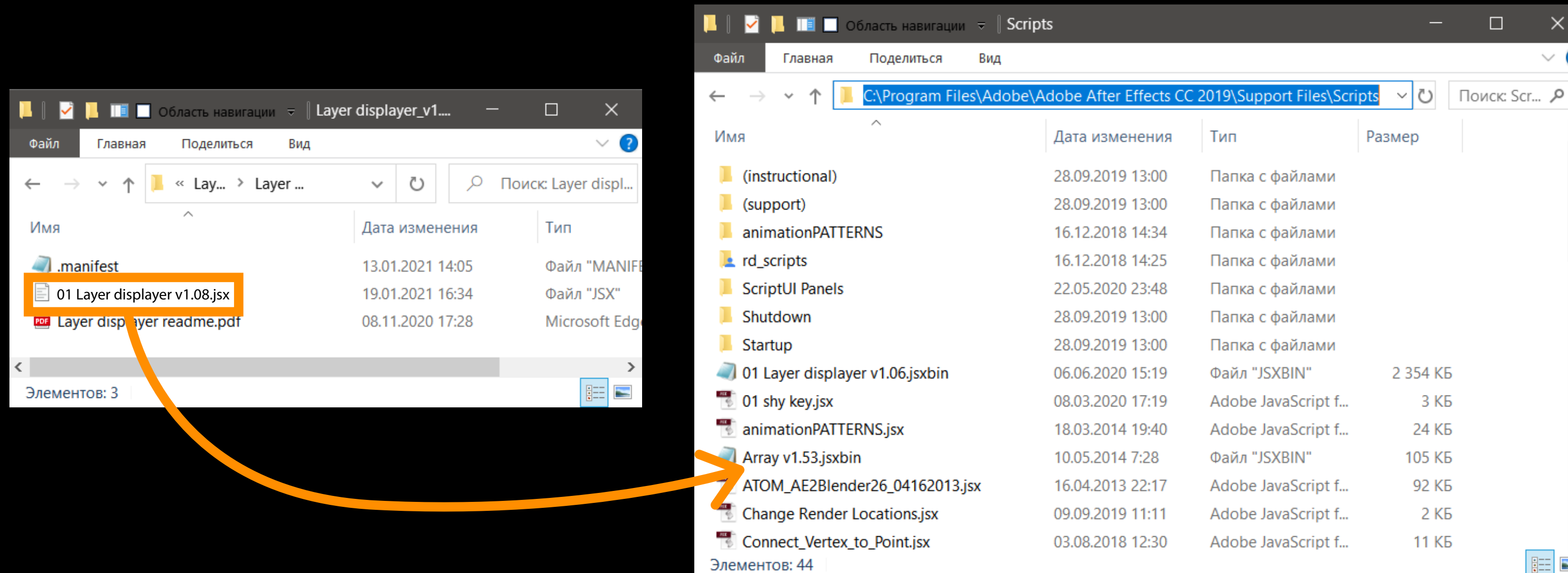
How to install

To install the script just copy the '01 Layer displayer.jsbin' into your Scripts directory.

On Mac it is in the Scripts folder, which is located in the same directory as your After Effects - program file,

On Windows you'll find it in 'Support Files\Scripts'.

You can then run script from the window menu in After Effects.

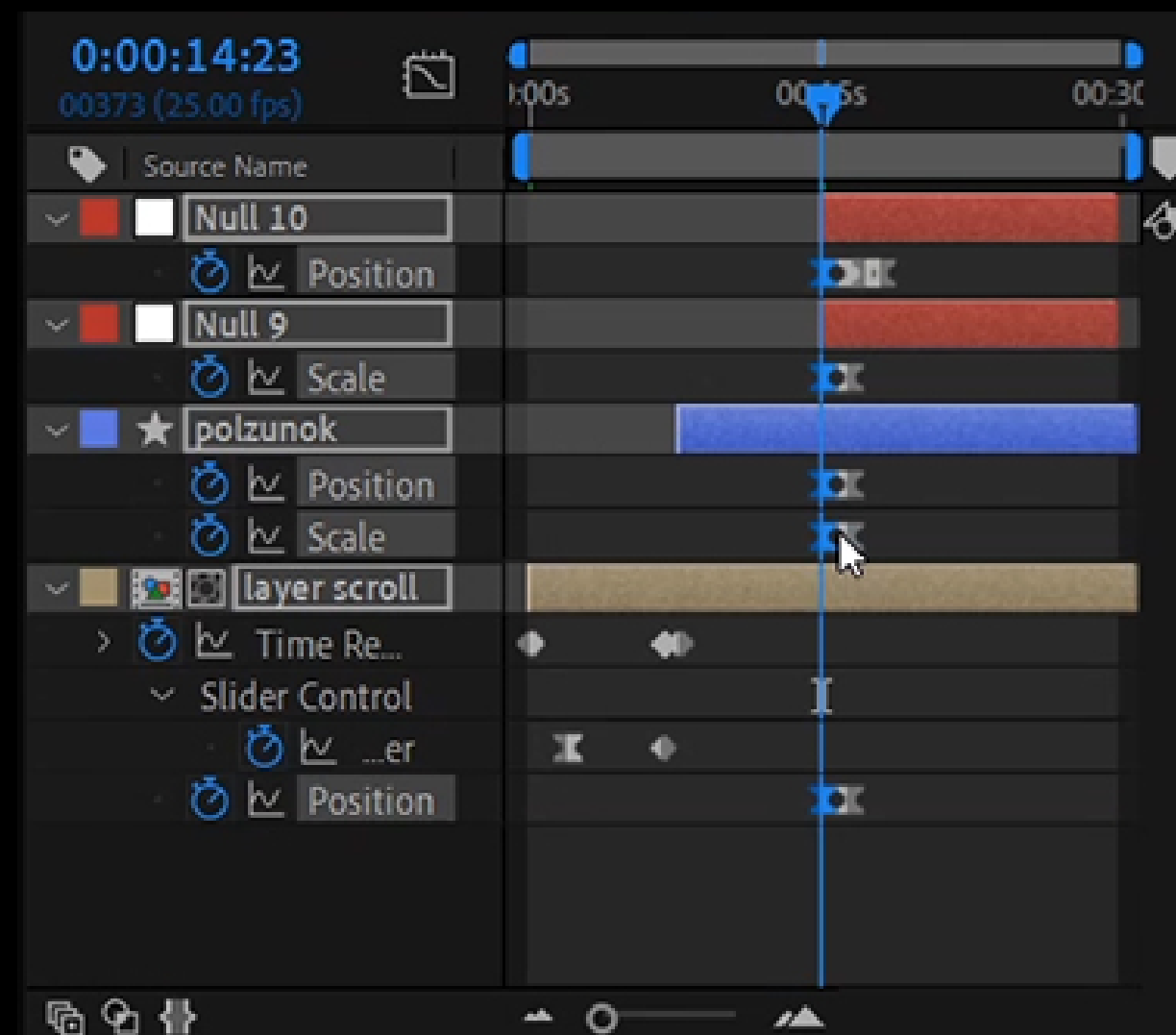

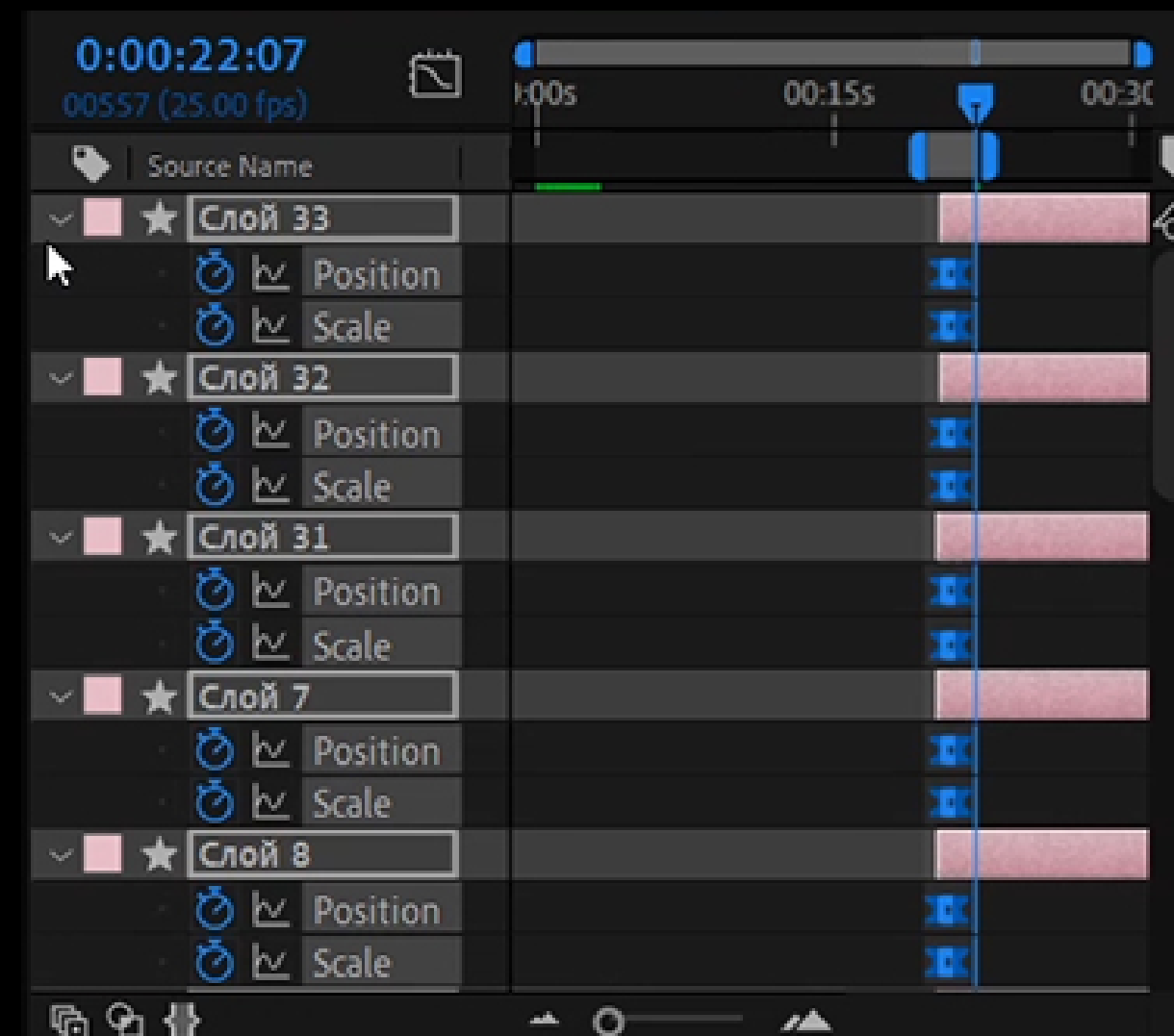
How to use console

After starting the script, a window will pop up in which the command line will be located. Commands should be entered into it for magic to occur.

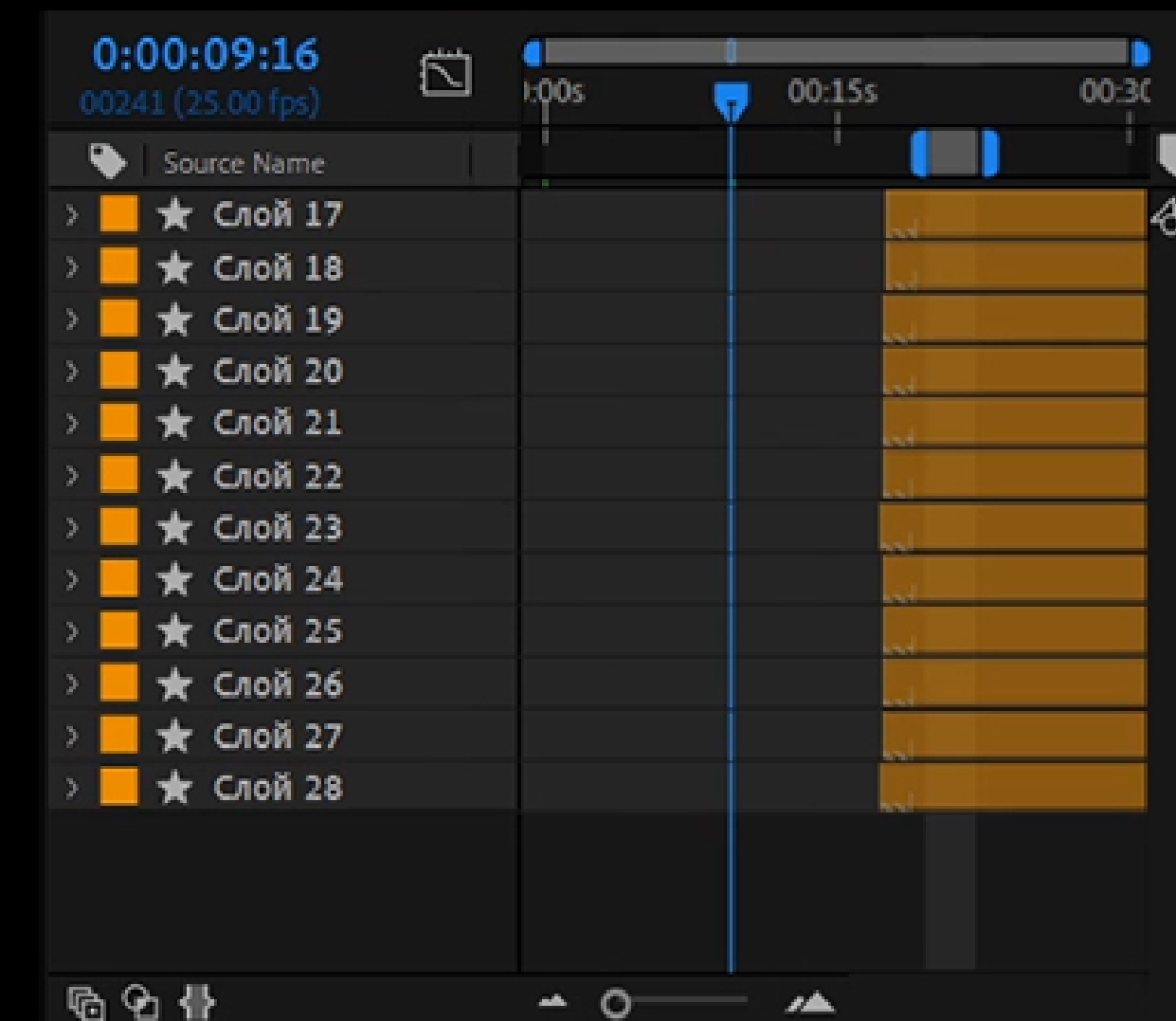
k - select all the keyframes under the current time indicator and hide all the untouched (doesn't work with stretched layer)



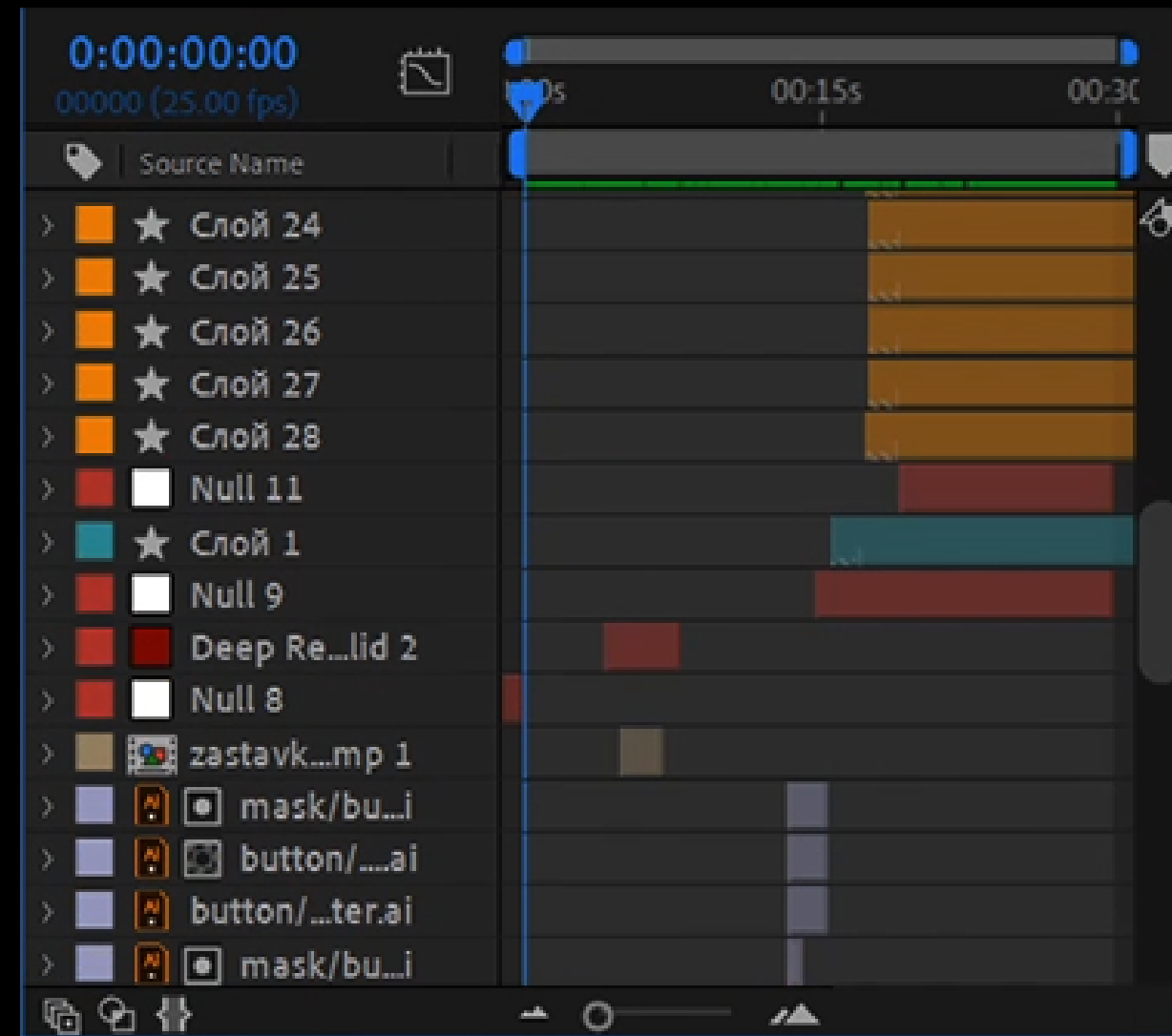
ks - select all the keyframes within the work area and hide all the untouched layers



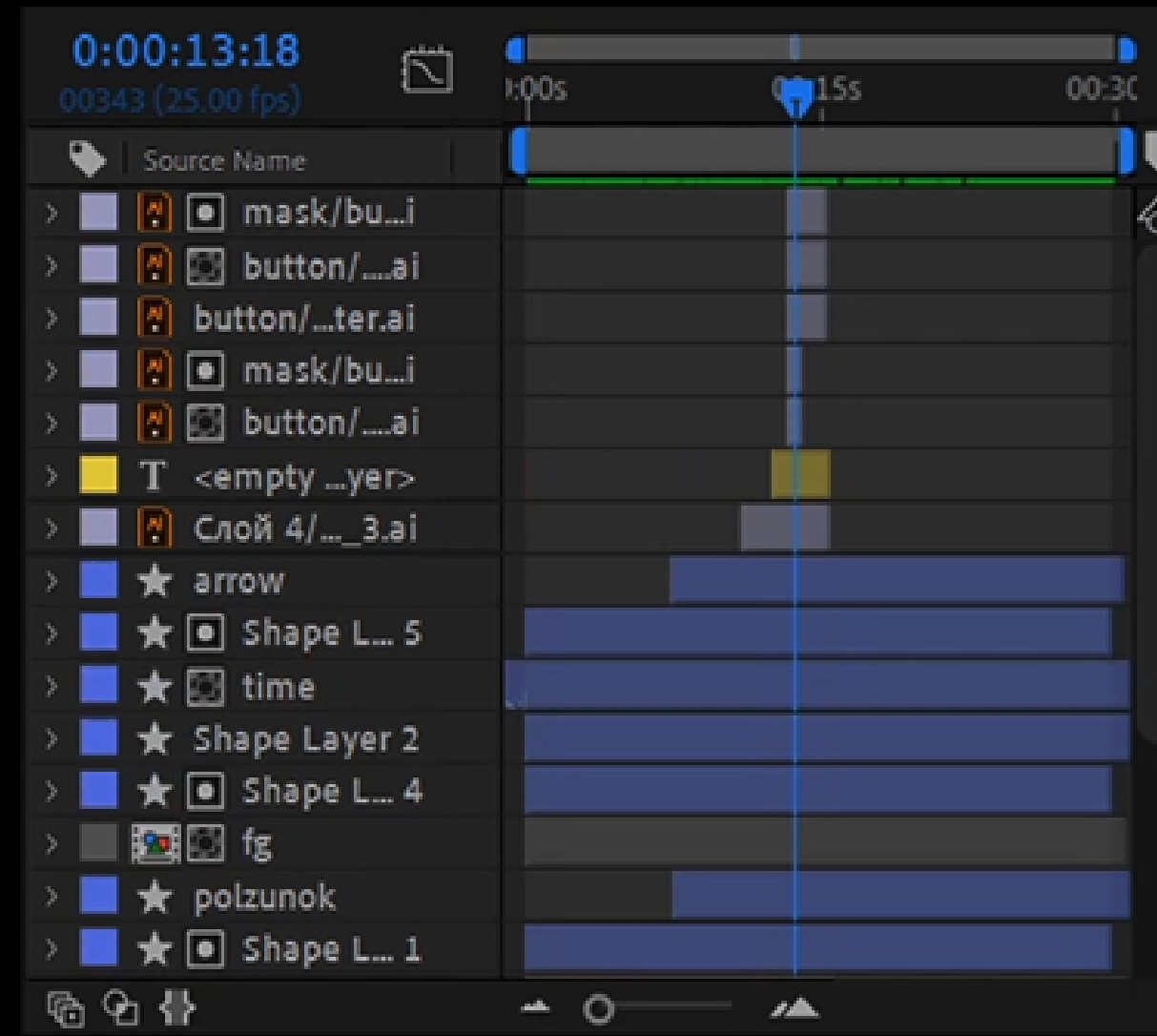
l# - reveal the layers with the label of the specific color The first two letters are enough (e.g. l#or). The layers with the label None will be ignored.



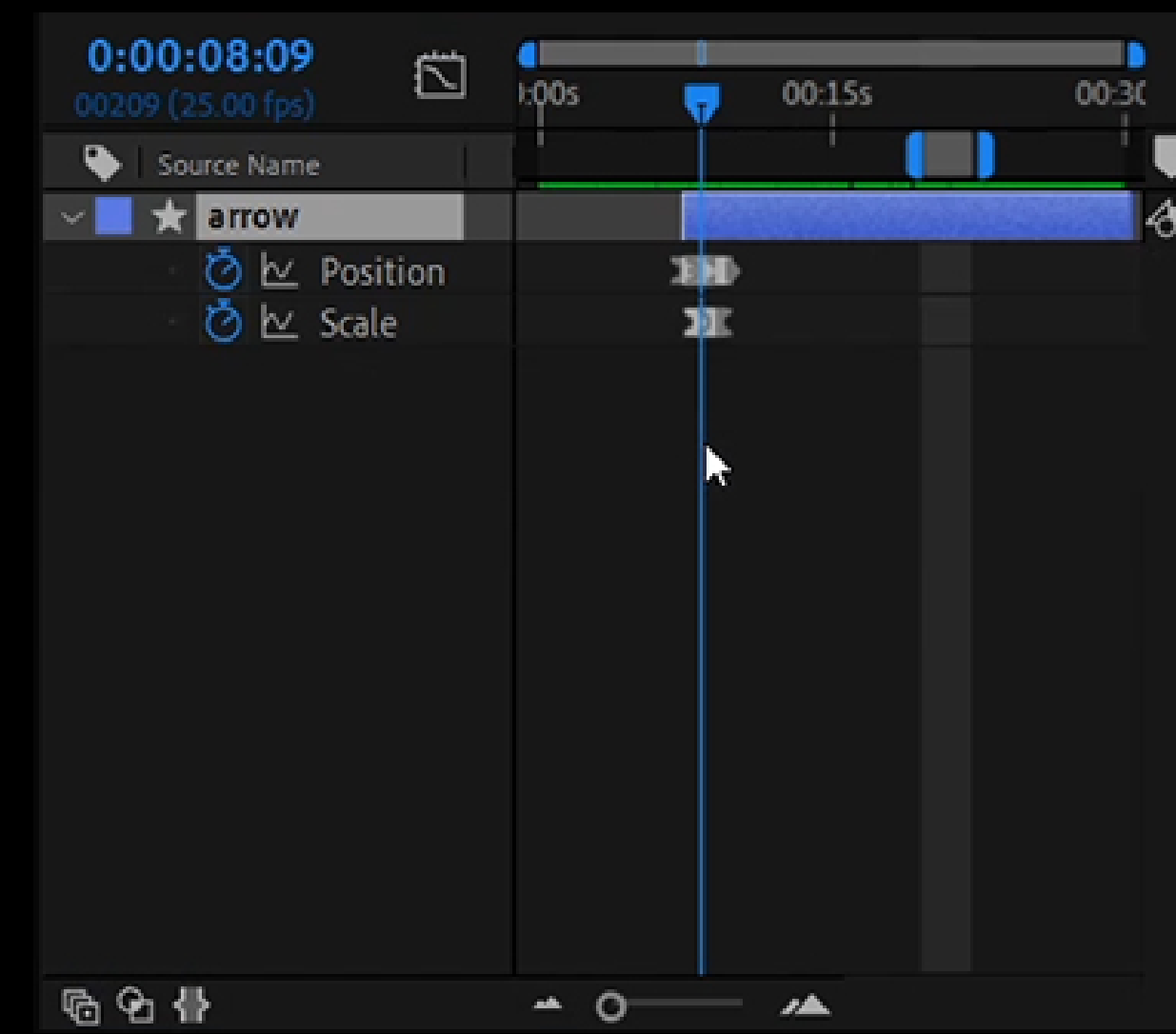
An empty field will reveal all the layers



t - reveal the layers that are under the time indicator

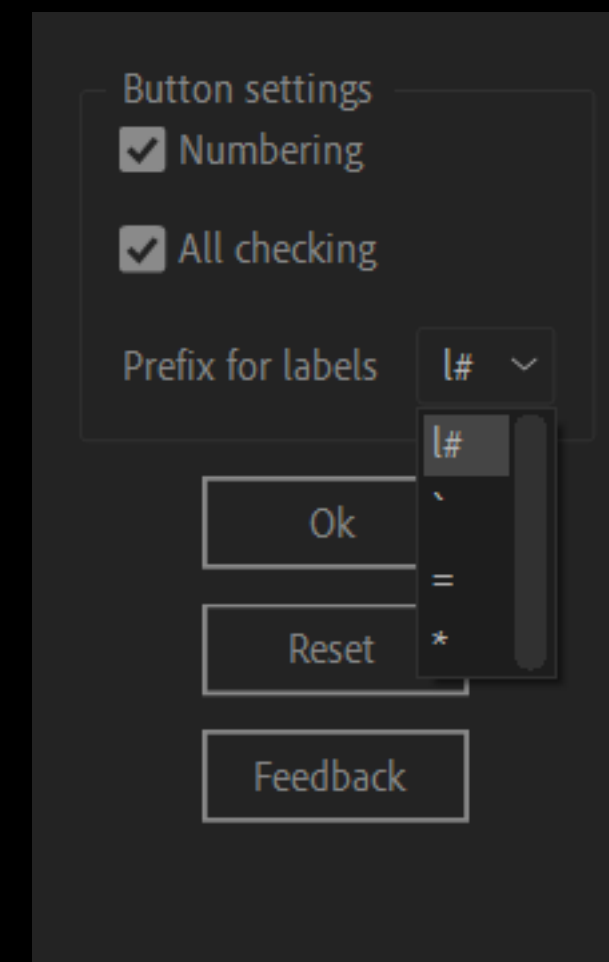


s - reveal the selected layers only



In version 1.07, functions have numbers. To access the function, you must sequentially enter the group number and the command number. For example 11 - will show layers in time, as if you entered "time" or "t". For a complete list of commands, see page 8.

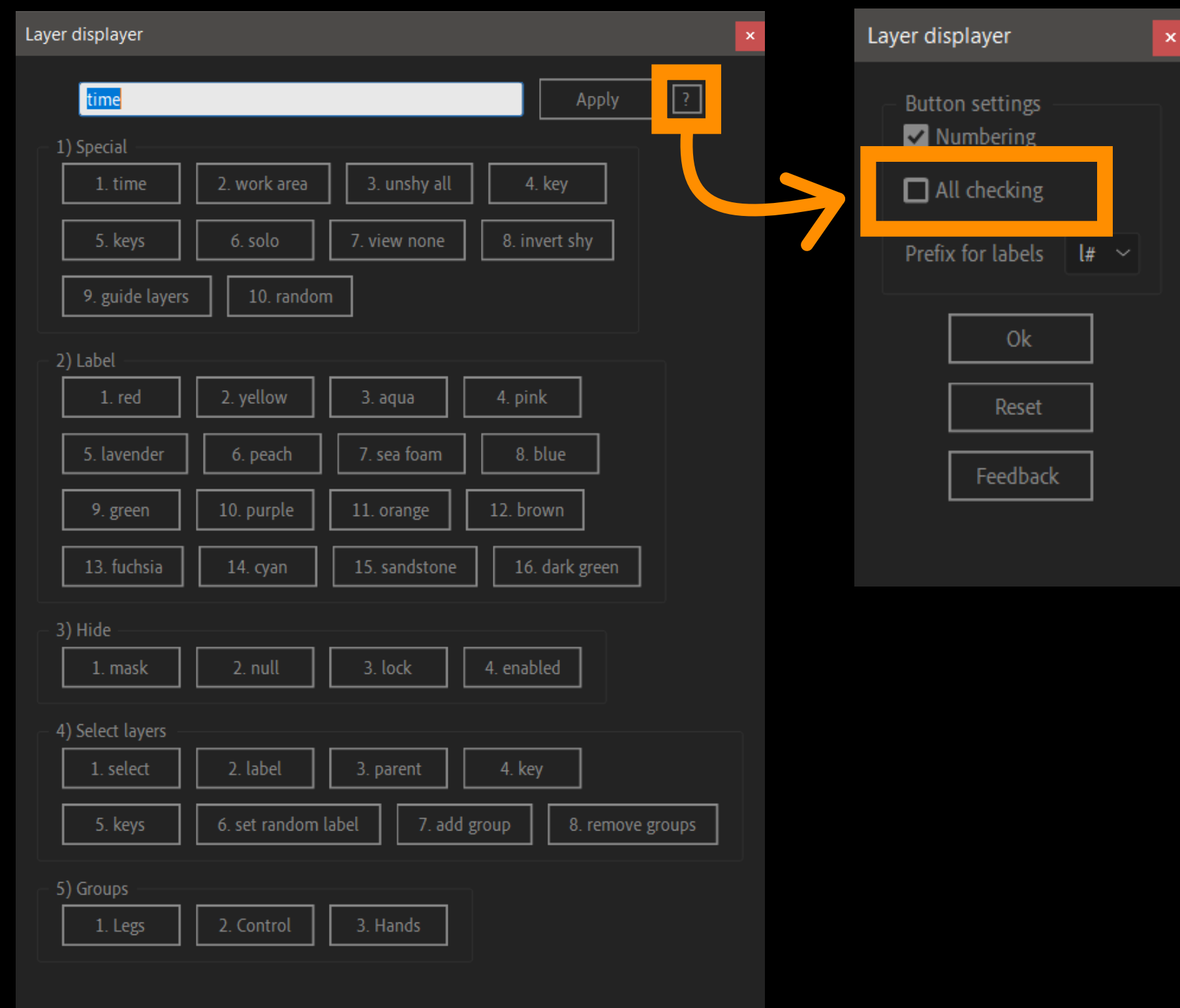
In the settings you can change the prefix for labels.



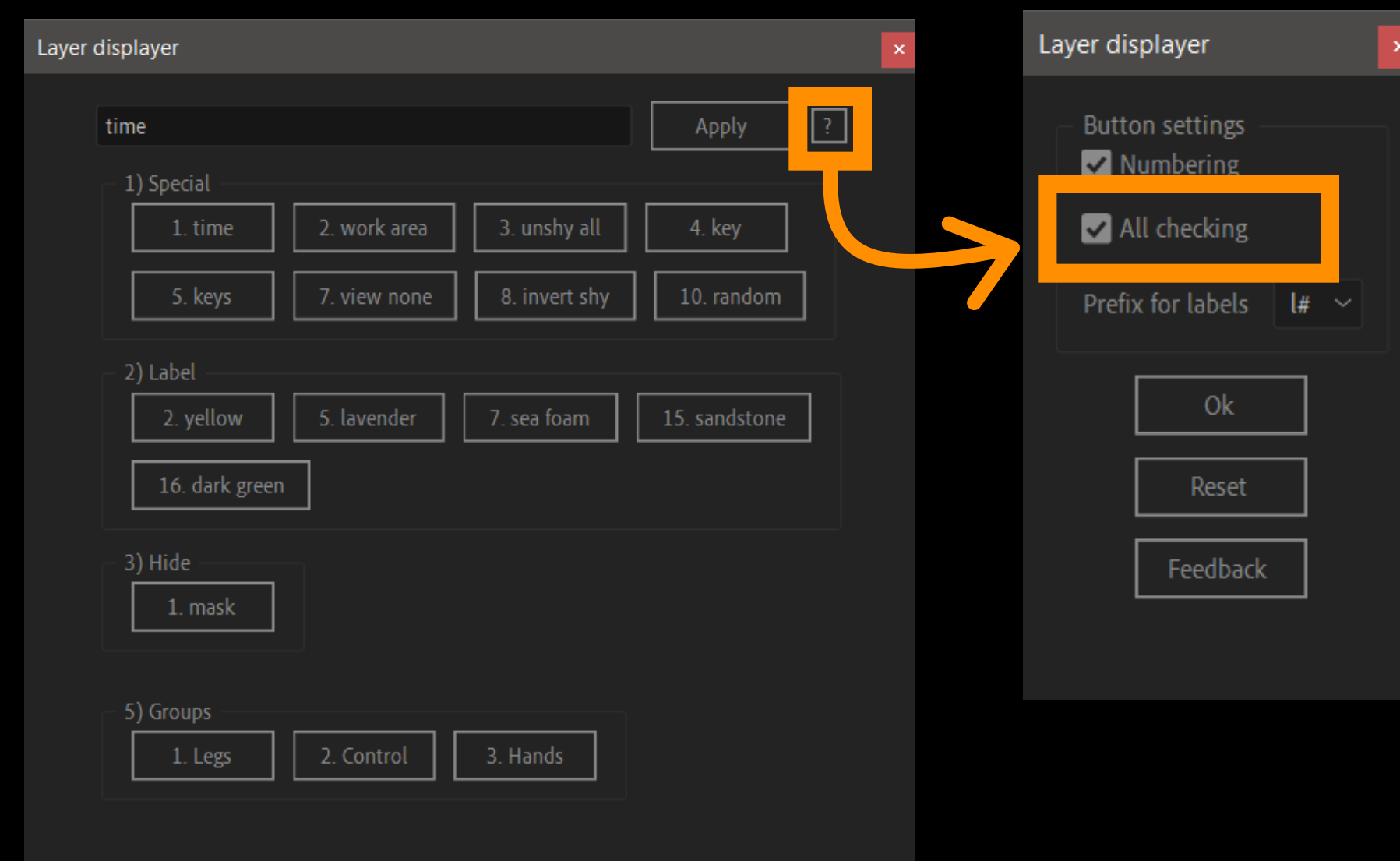
How to use buttons

By default, the buttons have the “All checking” mode enabled, which means that the panel will display only actual buttons corresponding to the active composition. This mode can be disabled in the settings, which can be accessed through the button with the question icon. You can also disable numbering for buttons and groups there. The “All checking” mode may slow down the script execution a little.

This is what the script looks like without the "All checking" option enabled.

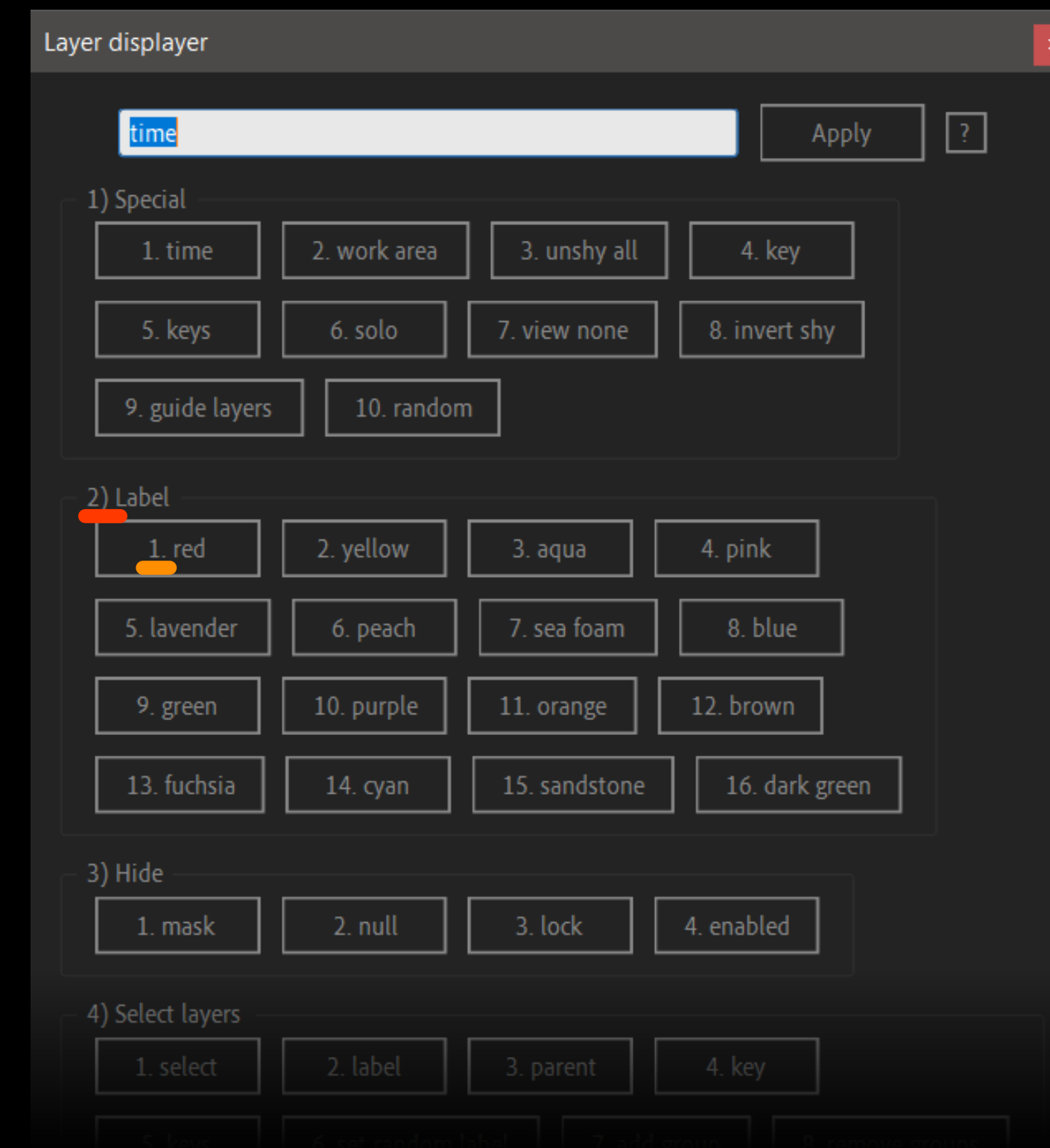
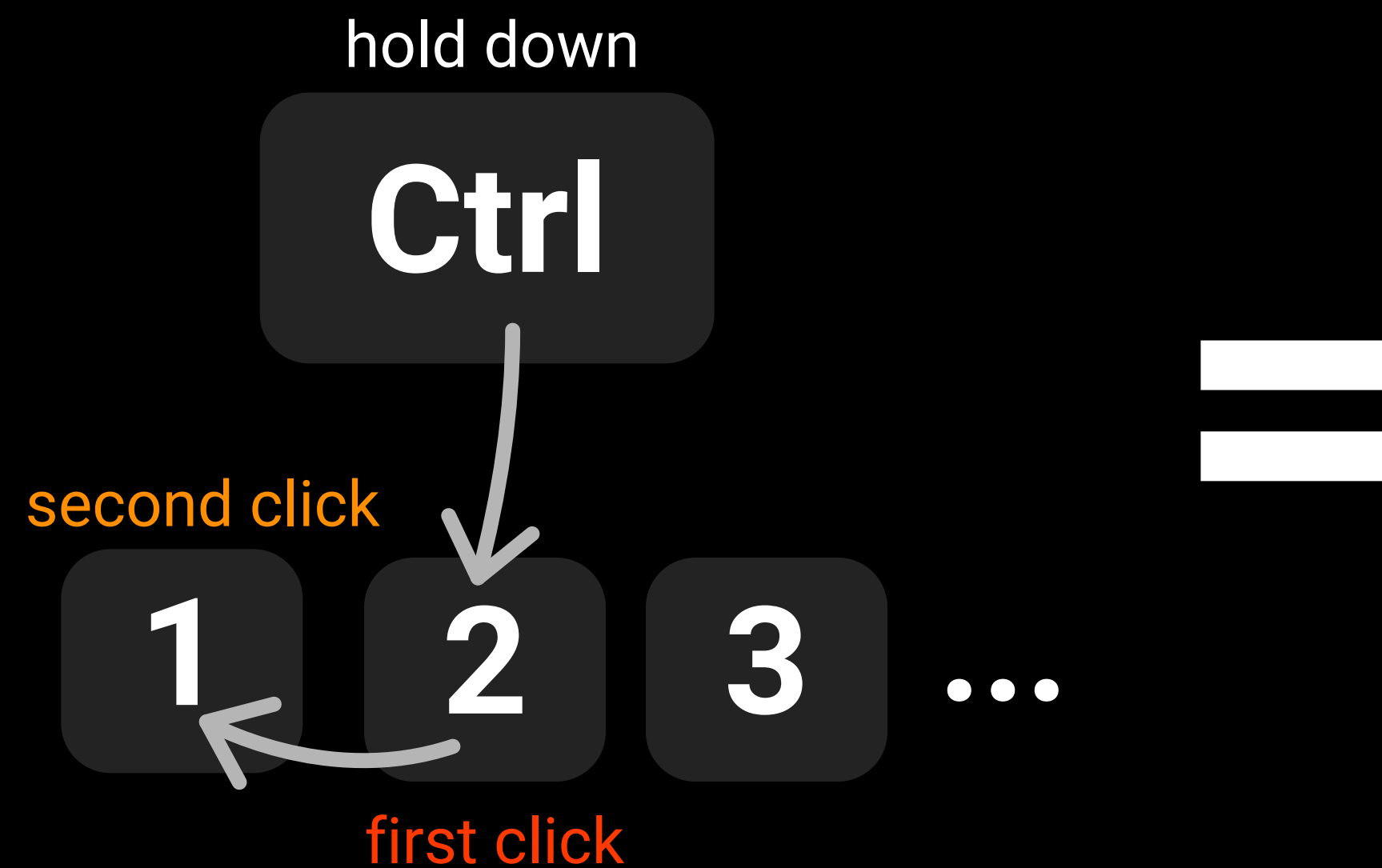


With the "All checking" option enabled, the buttons adjust to the active composition



How to use hotkeys(only for windows)

Windows users can use hotkeys. To do this, hold down ctrl and alternately click on the numbers. The first digit is the group number, the second is the order of the button in the group. Hot keys work on buttons: 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,0
For example, ctrl + 2 + 1 will only show the red layers.



A summary of all features(at default settings)

*Hotkeys can change depending on the context. The table contains hotkeys for disabled checks.
